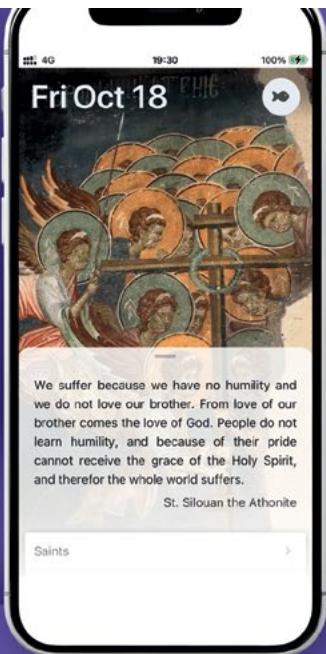

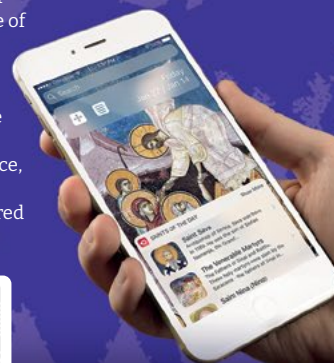

Stamatis Skliris. The Divine and Sacred Gospel, published by the Holy Synod, now serves as the official liturgical Gospel Book in all English-speaking territories. It replaces all previously used editions of the Gospel or Evangelion in liturgical services, including the 1982 edition, which will be retired from active use and respectfully placed in church libraries.

Tesla's Služebnik / Теслин Служебник

Tesla's Služebnik Facsimile Edition of the Oldest Known Serbian Liturgical Artifact in North America, published by Sebastian Press, presents a scholarly facsimile edition of Tesla's Služebnik, a 490-page liturgical volume recognized as the oldest known Serbian printed book in North America. Originally printed in 1519 in Venice by Božidar Vuković—a Montenegrin Serb and pioneering printer who fled the Ottoman conquest—this Služebnik is one of the earliest Cyrillic-printed editions of the Divine Liturgy and associated euchological texts. This rare volume, of immense historical and cultural significance for Serbian and broader Slavic ecclesiastical heritage, is housed in the Harry S. Truman Presidential Library in Independence, Missouri. Preserved and restored by the Library in 1977, it stands as a testament to the enduring legacy of Orthodox liturgical tradition and early Slavic printing in the diaspora.

Ideal for scholars of Slavic studies, liturgical history, and early printing, this edition offers critical access to a landmark in the spiritual and cultural history of the Serbian people.

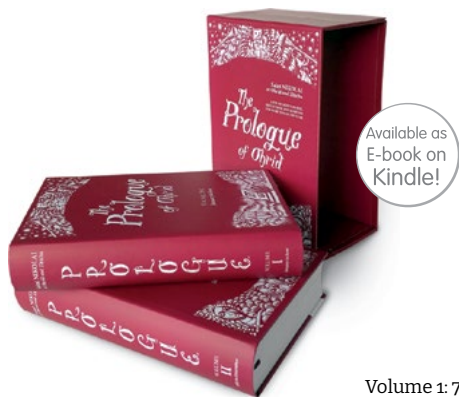

The Complete Synaxarion consist of 7 hardcover volumes, with 6 volumes, each one covering two months of the liturgical calendar (arranged in sequence by calendar date), and with over 550 pages in each volume, illustrated with numerous icons, miniatures, and ornaments from Byzantine manuscripts, some of these latter painted by the nuns of Ormylia. Each volume gives brief biographies of many of the saints commemorated each day of the month, an explanation of any major feasts celebrated during the month, plus spiritual readings. In this book, there are mediaeval saints long forgotten and now rediscovered, such as St Sabas of Vatopedi (5 October), alongside others who attained sanctity in confrontation with characteristically twentieth-century manifestations of evil, such as St Gorazd, Bishop of Slovakia and the Czech Lands (4 September), who was shot by the Nazis in 1942. They, and this book, are the best possible companions for the private devotions of Orthodox Christians, and indeed of all those faithful who wish to live in the Church's tradition.

Born in Montenegro, tonsured in Studenica Monastery, Serbia, educated in Moscow, Saint Petersburg, and elsewhere in the Russian Empire, called and placed to work in the Church and with the people in the diaspora in North America, Mardarije was manifested as a man of an entirely unusual spiritual format. His truly missionary work extended from the very end of Eastern Europe in distant Russia to the very western end of even more distant America.

The author of this book, Maxim Vasiljević, the most beloved bishop of Los Angeles, manages in this book a special (dare I say ecclesial) type of writing: He does not write to teach or to make known opinions, views, acquired information, or wise conclusions from the study of wise texts bequeathed to us by the Fathers of the Church. In short, he does not write to incite or facilitate the understanding of ecclesial truth or teaching. He is not interested in informing the reader. The aim and purpose of the writing here is to build a relationship of communion with the reader, to invite him to touch the empirical truth of the Church, and to make him a participant in these empirical touches.

I would dare to say that the "logic" of this book is to transmit experience and not just understanding—that is, to work with the dynamics of poetry, not with the logic of the presentation of ideas. For example, the poet Odysseas Elytis writes: "What I know not glows within me. And yet it glows." I would say that this phrase is the clearest possible formulation of empirical and not just intellectual knowledge.

During the 20th century, the patristic scholarship was only able to address the political thought of John Chrysostom in a piecemeal fashion. The present study constitutes the first systematic attempt to remedy this situation by providing a more all-encompassing view of the great Church Father's thinking about public life in Christian antiquity. Its first part is devoted to Chrysostom's perception of the relationship between Church and state. His view of his time's central state authority, the Roman Empire, is carefully reconstructed from select passages in his homiletic corpus. Particular care is taken to highlight the substantial differences between John Chrysostom and Eusebius of Caesarea insofar as their attitude toward the Roman Empire is concerned; these differences become visible primarily in the way that the two ecclesiastical authors make use of the motif of “synchronic parallelism,” that is to say, the temporal coincidence of Jesus' birth with Octavian Augustus' autocracy and the spread of the Pax Romana throughout the entire Mediterranean world.
